

#### **Heraldic Times**



(Insignia)

(Coat of Arms) Shield:

Gules, a conventionalized castle of Ehrenbreitstein with ramp or on mount proper, debruised by a bendlet argent bearing two ribbons of the field and azure with seventeen mullets of the last. A sinister canton bendy of eight ermine and of the field.

#### Crest:

On a wreath of the colors, or and gules, a mount argent garnished vert, bearing a linden leaf proper charged with a fleur-de-lis argent.

#### Motto:

In Time of Peace Prepare for War.

## **Symbolism:**

The field of the shield is red, the artillery color. The principal charge is the castle of Ehrenbreitstein bedruised by a bendlet carrying the American colors and seventeen stars, to signify the occupation of the castle by the 17th Field Artillery. The canton alludes to the arms of the 8th Field Artillery from which men were transferred to organize the 17th Field Artillery. The crest commemorates the two most noteworthy battle incidents. The White Mountain is for Blanc Mont. The leaf is taken from Verte Feuille Farm, one of the positions occupied by the regiment in the Soissons offensive; the linden leaf was chosen as being very common in that region. The fleur-de-lis is from the arms of Soissons.

#### **DISTINCTIVE INSIGNIA**

The distinctive insignia is the shield of the coat of arms.

To be eligible, for the 17th Artillery Regiment Association Grants, the applicant must be a child, grandchild or great-grandchild, of a parent, grandparent, great-grandparent that has served with or who is presently serving with any units of the 17th Artillery: Active, National Guard or Reserve Units. Those parents, grandparents or great-grandparents that have served or who are now serving with the regiment must have served or be currently serving under honorable conditions. If the parent, grandparent or great-grandparent received a discharge, under less than honorable conditions, then the applicant is not eligible. The terms child, grandchild and great-grandchild used above applies to both biological and

legally adopted children. Foster children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren are not eligible.

If the applicant has been previously awarded a scholarship grant from the 17th Artillery Regiment Association, then that applicant is not eligible to apply for another scholarship grant.

Applicant must be a graduating high school senior (Class of 2011) or a freshman, sophomore, or a junior attending any college, vocational school or technician school. Scholarship grants will be awarded in all areas of study.

# \$1000 Donation to Scholarship Fund

Alfred E. Mohr known to his friends as just plain Al was presented with a Certificate of Appreciation for his contribution to the 17th Artillery Regiment Associations Scholarship Fund by our Past President Jack Stroud.

Al Mohr is a veteran of WWII. He was assigned to the 78th Division during his time in the service. He was further assigned to K Company 310th Infantry. The full unit landed in France, the division then moved to Tongeren, Belgium on November 27, 1944, and to Rogen, Germany on December 7, 1944, to prepare the green troops for combat they would soon be involved in. The 310th Infantry Regiment after the training moved forward and relieved elements of the 1st Division in the line in the vicinity of Entenpfuhl, on 1-12 December. On the 13th the regiments smashed into Simmerath, Witzerath, and Bickerath and were fighting for Kesterich when Gerd Von Rundstedt launched his counteroffensive in the Monchau area, on 18 December (also known as the Battle of the Bulge).

The 78th held the area it had taken from the Siegfried Line against the violent German attacks throughout the winter. The Division attacked on 30 January 1945 and took Kesternich on 2 February. The unit then started the push for the town of Schmidt on the 8th. He was wounded on

February 9th while on the move to Schmidt. That was as far as Al made it. He laid in the forest for some time before he was approached by a German Medic that was with an American Medic who dressed his wounds and moved him to the aid station and then to the rear because of the severity of his wounds. It was not long after that Germany surrendered and the war was over. Al was put on a hospital ship and transported back to the U.S.

Al Mohr is a gentle man who is totally involved in his community in all aspects; Kiwanis, VFW, American Legion, Masons, Moose, and a true supporter of our troops. I was very proud to present this Certificate to him. He was overjoyed to receive it and said he did not expect anything in return for what he had done. He is truly a great friend of mine.

- Iraqi Sovereignty January 1, 2009 through a date to be determined. (TBD)

The campaigns identified for the ICM are:

- Liberation of Iraq March 19, 2003 to May 1, 2003.
- Transition of Iraq May 2, 2003 to June 28, 2004
- Iraqi Governance June 29, 2004 to December 15, 2005
- National Resolution December 16, 2005 to January 9, 2007.
- Iraqi Surge January 10, 2007 to December 31, 2008
- Iraqi Sovereignty January 1, 2009 to a date to be determined.

On September 1, 2010, Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) was renamed Operation New Dawn (OND) as the mission in Iraq became one of advisor, assistance, training and equipment role.
