(Coat of Arms)



(Insignia)

Shield:

Gules, a conventionalized castle of Ehrenbreitstein with ramp or on mount proper, bedruised by a bendlet argent bearing two ribbons of the field and azure with seventeen mullets of the last. A sinister canton bendy of eight ermine and of the field.

Crest:

On a wreath of the colors, or and gules, a mount argent garnished vert, bearing a linden leaf proper charged with a fleur-de-lis argent.

Motto:

In Time of Peace Prepare for War.

Symbolism:

The field of the shield is red, the artillery color. The principal charge is the castle of Ehrenbreitstein bedruised by a bendlet carrying the American colors and seventeen stars, to signify the occupation of the castle by the 17th Field Artillery. The canton alludes to the arms of the 8th Field Artillery from which men were transferred to organize the 17th Field Artillery. The crest commemorates the two most noteworthy battle incidents. The White Mountain is for Blanc Mont. The leaf is taken from Verte Feuille Farm, on of the positions occupied by the regiment in the Soissons offensive; the linden leaf was chosen as being very common in that region. The fleur-de-lis is from the arms of Soissons.

DISTINCTIVE INSIGNIA

The distinctive insignia is the shield of the coat of arms.

Note to all Reunion Attendees
Concealed Carried Weapons

Eligibility:

To be eligible, for a 17th Artillery Association Grant, the applicant must be a child, grandchild or great-grandchild, of a parent, grandparent, or great-grandparent who has served with or who is presently serving in the 17th Artillery Regiment.

Those parents, grandparents or great-grandparents who have served or who are now serving with the regiment must have served or be currently serving under honorable conditions. If the parent, grandparent or great-grandparent received a discharge, under less than honorable conditions, then the applicant is not eligible.

The terms child, grandchild and great-grandchild used above applies to both biological and legally adopted children. **Foster children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren are not eligible.**

If the applicant has been previously awarded a scholarship grant from the 17th Artillery Association, then that applicant is not eligible to apply for another scholarship grant. Applicant must be a graduating high school senior (Class of 2015) or a freshman, sophomore, or a junior attending any college, vocational school or technician school. Scholarship grants will be awarded in all areas of study.

REGIMENTAL MILESTONES for 2015:

1920: (95 years ago), The 17th Field Artillery Regiment was relieved from assignment to the 2nd Infantry Division.

1930: (85 years ago), The 17th Field Artillery Regiment was relieved from assignment to the 1st Infantry Division and reassigned to the 2nd Infantry Division.

The 3rd Battalion, 17th Field Artillery Regiment (Battery E & F) were reconstituted at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, and armed with 155mm howitzers.

1945: (70 years ago), End of World War II in Europe: On 29 April 1945 found the 17th Field Artillery Group (Motorized) located in Augsburg, Germany, from where it fired its last round of the war in support of the 3rd Infantry Division.

The 17th Field Artillery Battalion was located near the vicinity of Tarrons, Austria where Battery A fired the last round for the battalion at the Germans. The battalion fired a total of 150,014 rounds during World War II.

The 630th Field Artillery Battalion was located at Hall, Germany at the end of the war. (April 1945)

1950: (65 years ago), On 25 June 1950 when North Korea forces invaded South Korea, the 17th Field Artillery Battalion was station at Fort Sill, Oklahoma. Just 60 days later, elements of the 17th were put ashore at Pusan, South Korea – the first heavy artillery committed in Korea. Battery C fired the first round for the battalion on 14 September 1950. (The first 8 inch round, of the war).

1960: (55 years ago), On 31 March 1960, Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 7th Battalion, 17th Artillery was re-designated as Headquarters and Headquarters Battery, 7th Howitzer Battalion, 17th Artillery (organic elements concurrently constituted) and assigned to the 2nd Infantry Division. Battalion was activated on 2 May 1960 at Fort Benning, Georgia.

1965: (50 years ago), The Battalion Colors of the 7th Howitzer Battalion, 17th Artillery were moved to South Korea from Fort Benning, Georgia, when the 1st Cavalry Division and 2nd Infantry Division exchanged colors effective July 1, 1965.

The 2nd Howitzer Battalion, 17th Artillery deployed from Fort Sill, Oklahoma to Republic of South Vietnam on 14 August 1965. Battery B fired the first round for the battalion, from their Base Camp located at An Khe, on 7 September 1965.

The 5th Howitzer Battalion, 17th Artillery (USAR) inactivated 31 December 1965 at Beaumont, Texas, and relieved from assignment to the 90th Infantry Division.

1970: (45 years ago), Battery A, 2nd Battalion, 17th Artillery moved from Landing Zone (LZ) Action to Nha Trang. Battery B, 2nd Battalion, 17th Artillery moved from Landing Zone (LZ) Schueller to Dalat. Headquarters and Headquarters Battery and Service Battery 2nd Battalion, 17th Artillery moved from Camp Radcliff, An Khe to Ban Me Thout. (Battery C had moved from Camp Radcliff to Ban Me Thout in 1969)

1990: (25 years ago), Start of Operation Desert Shield. In September, both the 1st and 2nd Battalions, 17th Field Artillery deployed from Fort Sill, Oklahoma to Saudi Arabia. In October and November, the 3rd Battalion, 17th Field Artillery deployed from Germany, to Saudi Arabia.

1995: (20 years ago), On 1 March 1995, the 3rd Battalion, 17th Field Artillery was inactivated at Fort Sill Oklahoma,

2005: (10 years ago), July-August 2005, The 2nd Battalion, 17th Field Artillery, deployed from Iraq (Operation Iraqi Freedom) to Fort Carson, Colorado.

On 1 October 2005, the 2nd Battalion, 17th Field Artillery is re-designated as the 2nd Battalion, 17th Field Artillery Regiment.

On 1 October 2005, the 3rd Battalion, 17th Field Artillery is re-designated 3rd Battalion, 17th Field Artillery Regiment.

2010: (5 years ago), In July 2010, the 1st Battalion, 17th Field Artillery Regiment deployed from Fort Sill, Oklahoma to Afghanistan in support of the International Security Forces Afghanistan (ISFA) for Operation Enduring Freedom

The 3rd Battalion, 17th Field Artillery Regiment was inactivated at Joint Base Lewis-McCord, Washington on 9 September 2010.

On 17 October 2010, the 2nd Battalion, 17th Field Artillery Regiment was activated at Joint Base Lewis-McCord, Washington. (Reflagging of the 3rd Battalion)

OPERATION DESERT SHIELD – 25th ANNIVERSARY

This year of 2015 will be the 25th anniversary of Operation Desert Shield. In the early morning of August 2, 1990, Iraq invaded their neighboring country of Kuwait. On August 7, 1990 President George H. Bush orders Operation Desert Shield in response. This order prepared American to deploy its armed forces in the defense of Saudi Arabia.

This resulted in the three of the four active battalions of the 17th Field Artillery Regiment deploying along with other elements of the U. S. Armed Forces for the defense of Saudi Arabia.

The 1st Battalion deployed, in September 1990, as part of the 75th Field Artillery Brigade from Fort Sill, Oklahoma. The Brigade was task organized under XVIII Airborne Corps Artillery in support of defensive operations during Operation Desert Shield.

The 2nd Battalion deployed, also in September 1990, from Fort Sill, Oklahoma, as part of the 212th Field Artillery Brigade. The battalion was activated and assigned to the 212th Field Artillery Brigade in 1988.

During the months of November and December of 1990, the 3rd Battalion deployed from Ansbach, Germany to Saudi Arabia. This marked the first deployment of the battalion since their activation in Germany. The Battalion spent the first month establishing itself at Tactical Assembly Area (TAA) Brett and training to fight in a desert environment with numerous CPX's and FTX's. The 3rd Battalion was the only artillery battalion under the 210th Field Artillery Brigade to deploy along with the brigade's Headquarters and Headquarters Battery.

The fourth active battalion of the regiment remained Germany. With the deployment of Headquarters and Headquarter Battery, 210th Field Artillery Brigade, the 5th Battalion was reassigned to the 72th Field Artillery Brigade In addition, the 72nd Field Artillery Brigade with attached units were transferred from assignment from VII Corps Artillery to V Corps Artillery.

DEPLOYMENT TO VIETNAM:

2015 is the 50th Anniversary of the deployment of the 2nd Howitzer Battalion, 17th Artillery from Fort Sill, Oklahoma to An Khe, South Vietnam

The year 1965 saw the 2/17th Artillery continuing its mission of support for the Artillery School at Fort Sill, while maintaining its STRAC Combat Readiness.

The Annual General Inspection took place 15-16 March 1965. The battalion emerged from the inspection with an overall rating of Excellent. The Battalion Personnel Section achieved a Superior rating in this inspection.

The week of April 19-23, 1965 saw the battalion participating in the 41st Artillery Group Field Artillery Training Exercise (FTX) on Fort Sill's West Range. The training included reconnaissance, selection and occupation of Artillery positions (RSOP'S), firing from hasty positions along route of movement ("hipshoots"), forward observers and fire direction procedures, including aerial observation, and climaxing by an artillery illumination demonstration utilizing searchlights and flares.

Alert On 25 June 1965, exactly seven years from the redesignation of the 2d Howitzer Battalion, 17th Artillery (25 June 1958), the battalion received a classified message from Department of the Army alerting it for possible deployment to the Republic of Vietnam.

As the wheels concerning preparation for overseas movement started into motion, the battalion took time out on 29 June 1965 to commemorate its Organization Day. The day's activities included a live firing demonstration, utilizing the 105mm howitzer crew composed of 2d LT's, a review and awards ceremony, culminating in a relaxing afternoon of fun, games and good food at the 214th Artillery Group Recreational Area. Of special note concerning the awards, CPT Paul T. Wickliffe, C Battery Commander, received the Air Medal with V device for his actions as a helicopter pilot in Vietnam some months ago.

Preparations for overseas movement continued at a fast and furious pace for the next six weeks. The battalion's personnel had to be brought up to 100% from below 70% at the time of the alert, leaves had to be granted for movement of dependents, and equipment had to be inspected, repaired or replaced, new items requisitioned, and packed for shipment.
