#### Heraldic Times





(Coat of Arms) Shield:

Gules, a conventionalized castle of Ehrenbreitstein with ramp or on mount proper, debruised by a bendlet argent bearing two ribbons of the field and azure with seventeen mullets of the last. A sinister canton bendy of eight ermine and of the field.

#### Crest:

On a wreath of the colors, or and gules, a mount argent garnished vert, bearing a linden leaf proper charged with a fleur-de-lis argent.

#### Motto:

In Time of Peace Prepare for War.

#### Symbolism:

The field of the shield is red, the artillery color. The principal charge is the castle of Ehrenbreitstein bedruised by a bendlet carrying the American colors and seventeen stars, to signify the occupation of the castle by the 17th Field Artillery. The canton alludes to the arms of the 8th Field Artillery from which men were transferred to organize the 17th Field Artillery. The crest commemorates the two most noteworthy battle incidents. The White Mountain is for Blanc Mont. The leaf is taken from Verte Feuille Farm, on of the positions occupied by the regiment in the Soissons offensive; the linden leaf was chosen as being very common in that region. The fleur-de-lis is from the arms of Soissons.

#### **DISTINCTIVE INSIGNIA**

The distinctive insignia is the shield of the coat of arms.

#### Sergeant Charles L. Stoddard, Battery B, 17<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery Regiment

Sergeant Stoddard was assigned to regiment on March 20, 1941, at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, as the Motor Sergeant for Battery B. Sergeant Stoddard served with the regiment through North Africa and after a year of combat due to a two month period of sickness, he was sent to the hospital. Upon his return to the regiment in March 1944, a replacement had been received in his place. Sergeant Stoddard was then sent to a replacement depot, in Italy, where he was further assigned to the 157<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment, 45<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division and remained there until the end of the war.

\*It should be noted that the French built stubby box-trail Schneider 155mm Howitzers was the same howitzer used by the regiment during World War I and arrived from Camp Travis, Texas to Camp Bragg, North Carolina in 1921. The World War I – vintage Schneider after some modification was used by the regiment during the first years in World War II, although the 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion (Batteries D, E, & F) lost all of their Schneider Howitzers, on February 24, 1943, after being attacked by the 10<sup>th</sup> Panzer Division at Faid Pass, Tunisia.
