## President's View from the Observation Post By Gil Bernabe

In 2017 the 17<sup>th</sup> Artillery Regiment marked 100 years of service to the Nation. As we mentioned in our January Newsletter, 2018 will be a year when we remember our Fallen Heroes who sacrificed their lives in 1968. This year - 2018 - marks 50 years since the 1968 Tet Offensive; and 50 years since the April 3, 1968, Viet Cong sapper attack on Charlie Battery, 2d Battalion, 17<sup>th</sup> Artillery. August 2018 will also be 50 years since Bravo Battery suffered the losses of PFC Clifford Draper and Corporal Stephen Jordan. It is also 50 years since a former 2d Battalion, 17<sup>th</sup> Artillery Commander, LTC Robert Whitback, was killed during Tet in January 1968 while assigned to his new unit.

On April 3, 2018, at 10:00 am, Bill Beers and several of his veteran friends met me at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial (The Wall) in Washington, DC, for a Ceremony of Remembrance. Bill and Cuma Beers were accompanied by two couples: Richard and Jane Alderton, USAF Veteran and Bud and Melinda Wagner, US Army Veteran. We all gathered in front of Panel 47E, and, touched all the names of our Charlie Battery comrades who were killed on Landing Zone George on Ky Son Mountain near Tuy Puoc, Binh Dinh Province, South Vietnam. As we stood in front of Panel 47E, we were joined by a crowd of tourists from all over the United States and some from Europe. The crowd easily numbered between 50 to 70 people and they listened intently, as I read my remarks. My remarks, "Remembering the Fallen Heroes of the 17<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery Regiment Who Gave All!", are printed elsewhere in this Newsletter. The crowd was respectfully quiet, as Bill Beers and I read all the names of the Charlie Battery Heroes and then the names of all the other 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, 17<sup>th</sup> Artillery casualties from the Vietnam War.

April 2018 was a busy month – as our Scholarship Committee evaluated and selected the winners of the 2018 17<sup>th</sup> Artillery Regiment Association Scholarship Program. The four winners were Ashley Beard, Carrie Snelbaker, Olivia Guerrette, and Daniel Bratcher. Those super students earned GPA's ranging from 3.7 to 4.72; and were very involved in their school and community activities. For me – as the Chairman of the Scholarship Committee, it was unique to have two Great-Grand-Children compete for our annual scholarships. CSM Delmar Beard who recently turned 92 is smiling and proud of his two Great Grand-Children – Ashley Beard and Daniel Bratcher. Read about all four winners elsewhere in this Newsletter. As of this Newsletter, the 17<sup>th</sup> Artillery Regiment Association has awarded 44 scholarship, totaling \$57, 420.00, to very deserving students.

The four scholarships totaled \$5,500.00. Each scholarship winner received a monetary award, a Letter of Congratulations, and a framed 17th Regiment Association Certificate Artillery of Achievement. Each year the 17th Artillery Regiment Association awards scholarship grants to children and grand children of veterans and current active duty soldiers who have served with this proud regiment. Applicants must meet the association's eligibility requirements and are evaluated on academic achievement, community service, extra-curricular activities at school, an essay on a different annual topic, and a faculty member's Letter of Recommendation.

The 2018 first-place winner is Ashley A. Beard, a 2018 graduate of Northwest Christian School in Phoenix, AZ. Throughout Miss Beard's four years of high school, she challenged herself by taking nine Dual Enrollment College Courses, five Honors Courses, and two Advanced Placemen Courses and maintained a 4.72 Grade Point Average. She ranked in the top 8% of her senior class – 9<sup>th</sup> out of 113.

A review of her extra-curricular activities demonstrates that she was always a hard worker and well organized. She dedicated herself to achieving outstanding grades in all her courses; and she excelled in community service and sports. She competed on her school's Varsity tennis team and cross-country team for all four years and was the Team Captain of the Cross-Country Team. Ashley earned a Varsity Letter in both sports. Ashley was a key member of Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA), as Vice President, and was in charge of getting FCA information out to her school's weekly announcements. She was also in charge of FCA social media account. Ashley served as a volunteer for three years in Student Missionary Internship where she and other students trained for 13 weeks and then travelled to California to put on Vacation Bible School for poverty-stricken areas and churches. ### <u>"Remembering the Fallen Heroes of the</u> <u>17<sup>th</sup> Field Artillery Regiment</u> who gave all!"

The following remarks were read at The Vietnam Veterans Memorial by 17<sup>th</sup> Artillery Regiment Association President, Gil Bernabe.

Fifty Years ago, today – on the morning of April 3, 1968 – an enemy sapper unit of unknown size attacked Charlie Battery,  $2^{nd}$  Battalion,  $17^{th}$  Artillery – which was occupying a fire base near the village of Tuy Puoc in Binh Dinh Province in the Republic of Vietnam.

At 1:30 in the morning, enemy B-40 rockets were launched from outside the unit perimeter at bunkers in the battery area.

The fire direction center bunker received the first round.

Several enemy attackers entered the perimeter unnoticed and using sachet charges - destroyed the battery observation post.

At approximately the same time – part of the perimeter barrier wire was destroyed allowing the enemy to breach the battery position in force.

Enemy sappers inside the perimeter - using satchel charges, grenades, and small arms - attacked the fire direction center, the executive post, two howitzer emplacements and perimeter bunkers on the north side of the battery area. At the same time – a second breach of the perimeter was made.

During the attack – battery personnel fired direct fire with a 105 mm howitzer and were supported by a South Vietnamese Army platoon with 105 mm howitzers firing illumination.

Helicopter flare ship, gunships, and an observation aircraft provided additional support.

After approximately four hours of heavy fighting and with the aid of repeated strikes by supporting gunships and the O-1 observation aircraft - the men of Charlie Battery – regained control of the battery position; and the enemy withdrew.

Charlie Battery suffered 11 KIA and 22 WIA and today we remember those brave soldiers – those great warriors!

We also remember ALL our other Artillerymen who served Our Nation in Vietnam and made the Supreme sacrifice.





The picture shows Private James Howard Hurd (left) and an unknown comrade at Camp Robinson, Wisconsin in November 1917. Picture was taken a couple of days prior to the deployment of the regiment to France. Private Hurd is in the guard uniform, at the time, armed with a .45 Cal. 1911 Pistol. Private Hurd enlisted on August 23, 1917 and was initially assigned to the Supply Company of the Regiment, and then he was transferred to Battery D on October 23, 1917. Private Hurd died of wounds on June 20, 1918 after Battery D came under heavy German artillery fire.

The picture was sent to the association by Mr. Clark Baker (USMC/LAPD, Ret) from his family records. Mr. Clark's grandmother was in correspondence with Private Hurd at the time of World War I. Mr. Clark also provided two copies of the letters that Private Hurd mailed to his grandmother.

Here are some excerpts from Private Hurd letters concerning his training at Camp Robinson: "Working hard on foot drills and learning a lot of things, such as the Semaphored Signaling with flags". "Walking to our tents, to sleep in, while on the march, taking hikes over the hills and such like", "They send us where ever is a regiment not filled up. We are almost filled up now and expect to leave soon" and "Yes, the big guns on the land is the type we use here it is drawn by a team of 8 horses, one man to two horses".
